Sphinx - A stone carving with the head of a human and the body of a lion	Pyramids - A large stone tomb for an Egyptian king or queen, with sides like triangles	Obelisk - A tall pointed stone put up in memory of a person
Temple - Place of worship of a deity	Sarcophagus – Egyptian coffin	Hieroglyphics – a form of writing that uses pictures instead of letters
Physicians - doctors	Anatomy – The study of how bones and muscles in the human body fit together	Casket – a small wooden box to keep jewellery in












. Minerals slowly soak into the emains, turning them to stone.	5. The remains are now a fossil. The land starts to change slowly.	6. Sometimes, the rock wears away or shifts, exposing the fossil.





