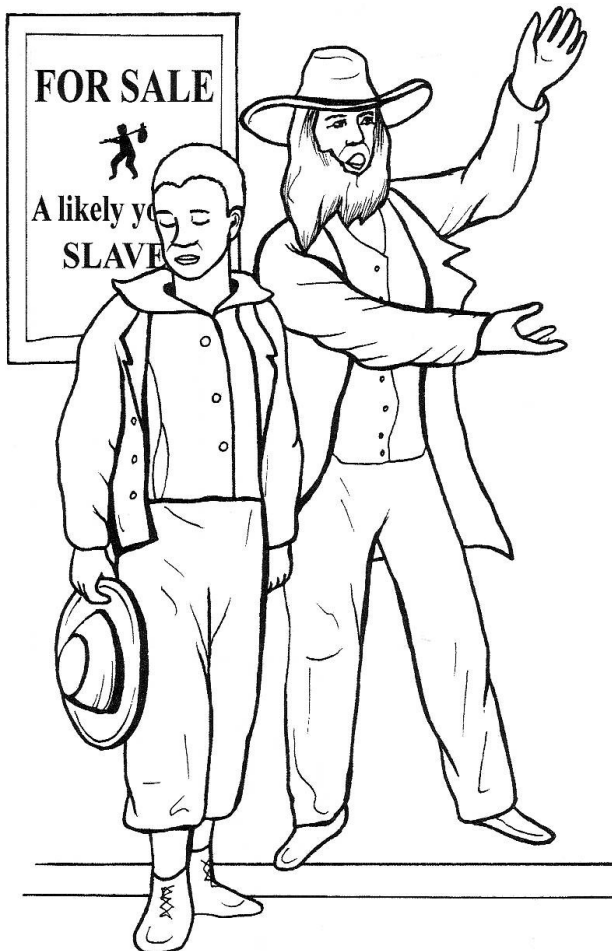


The Slave Trade Ends



- In England and in both Americas, there was much talk of the evils of slavery. William Wilberforce argued for the abolition of the slave trade. In 1807, England did outlaw the slave trade.
- English ships would no longer be traveling to the coast of Africa to buy and sell slaves.
- England outlawed the slave trade in 1807.
- England finally outlawed slavery in 1833. Plantations began to break up. But England could still get sugar, coffee, cotton, and tobacco from America.

Plight - A situation from which release is difficult.

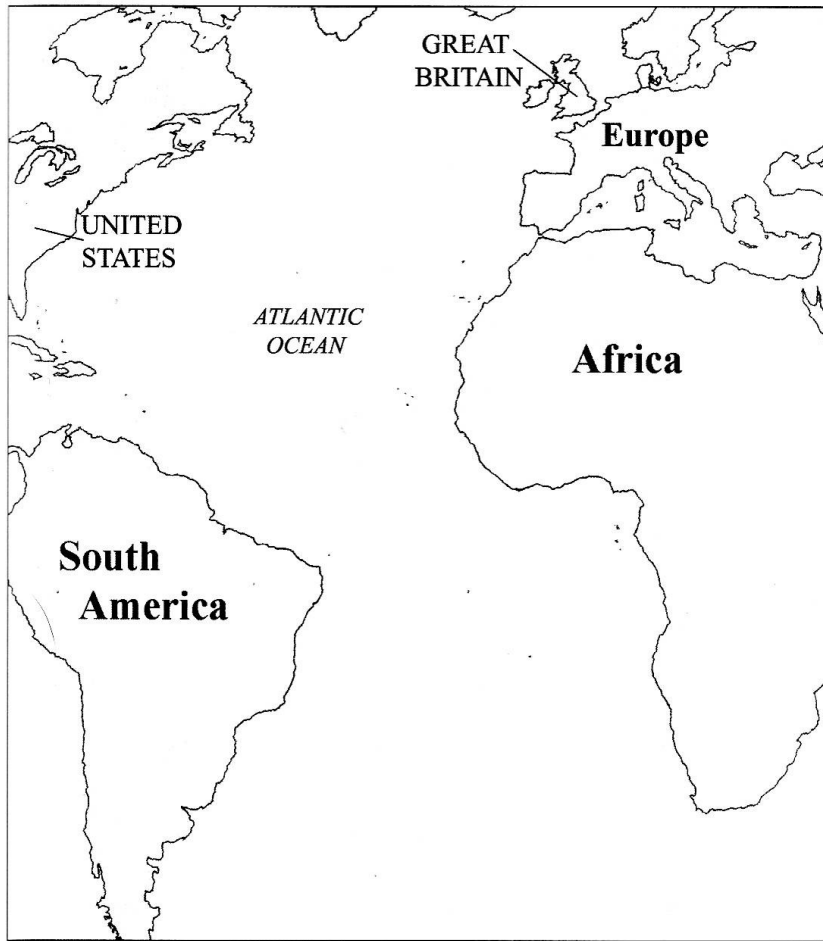

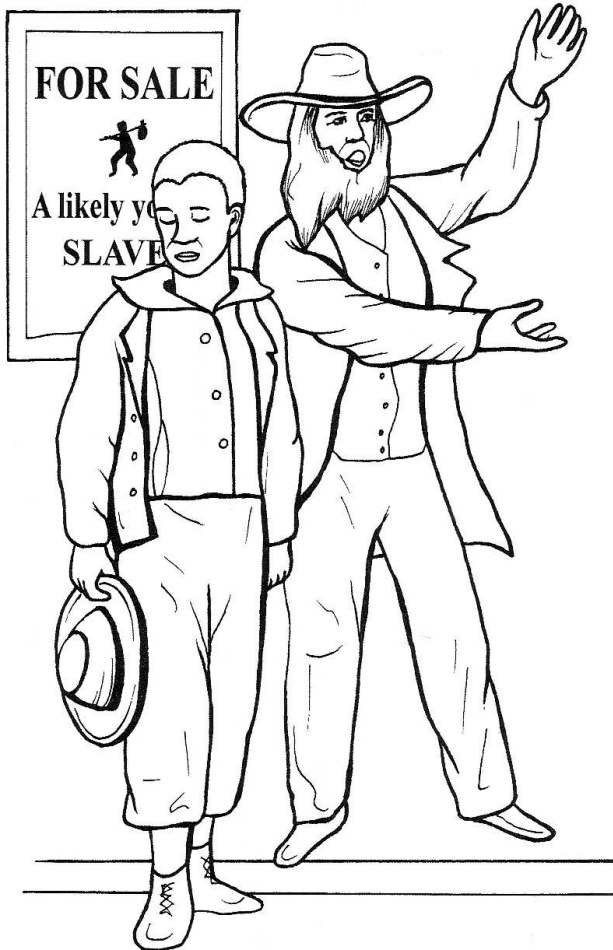
Slave trade - The buying and selling of slaves.
